ORDER

This Criminal Original Petition has been filed seeking orders to grant special leave to the petitioner to file the appeal against the judgment of acquittal passed in C.C.No.576 of 2017, dated 03.07.2023 passed by the learned Judicial Magistrate Fast Track Court at Magistrate Level, Karur.

The petitioner/complainant filed a complaint for the offence under Section 138 of Negotiable Instruments Act and after trial, the learned Magistrate has passed the judgment, dated 03.07.2023, acquitting the respondent/accused and that therefore, the petitioner was constrained to file the above appeal.
