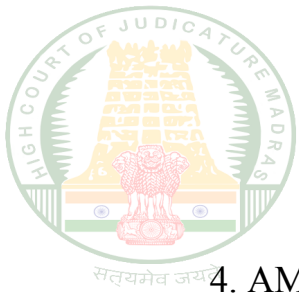

The relief sought for in the writ petition is to direct the 1st respondent to dispose of the petitioner's representation dated 23.01.2019.

2. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner would submit that serious irregularities in dealing with the temple properties are identified. The representation submitted to the 1st respondent who in turn has not responded. Thus, the writ petition came to be instituted.

4. The writ petition stands disposed of with the above observations.

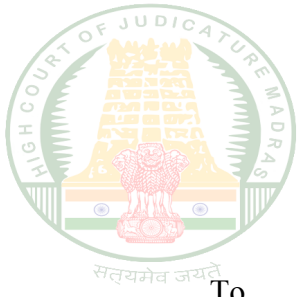
