PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.482 of BNSS

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.127 of 2025 on the file of the Respondent-Police.



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ORDER: The Court made the following order :-

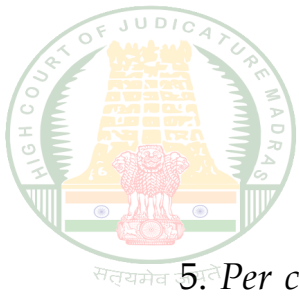
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This Criminal Original Petition has been filed by the petitioners on 28.04.2025 under Section 482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), 2023, praying to grant an order of pre-arrest bail.

2. The petitioners / Accused Nos. 2 and 4 apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent- police for the alleged offences punishable under Sections 303(2) of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), 2023 (corresponding Section 379 of IPC) and Section 21(1) of Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation), Act, 1957, in Crime No.127 of 2025 on the file of the respondent-police.

3. The case of the prosecution is that on 18.03.2025, on receiving a secret information that a lorry has got struck in Vaigai River, the defacto complainant- Village Administrative Officer along with his officials rushed to the spot and found that the petitioners herein, were illegally excavating and transporting ½ unit of River sand by using a Lorry bearing Regn.No.TN 67P4266. Hence, the case.

4. Mr.V.Vishnu, the learned counsel for the petitioners, submits that the petitioners are innocent persons, they have not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution, and they have been falsely implicated in this case. He however submits that the petitioners are ready to abide any conditions to be imposed by this Court. Accordingly, he prays to grant an order of pre-arrest bail to the petitioners.



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5. *Per contra*, Mr.M.Karunanithi, the learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) appearing for the respondent-police, submits that both, the vehicle and minerals, were seized. He further submits that the investigation of the case is pending and therefore, at this stage, if the pre-arrest bail is granted to the petitioners, they may cause threat to the defacto complainant and witnesses. Hence, he prays to dismiss this Criminal Original Petition.

6. Heard on both sides. This Court has perused the records.

7. Considering the fact that the illegally transported river sand, has been seized along with the said lorry, the custodial interrogation of the petitioners is not necessary for investigating agency in this case. Further, the petitioners have permanent residence and deep roots in the society. Therefore, there is less possibility of absconding. Considering the above and also considering the facts and circumstances of the case and the nature of the offence alleged against the petitioners and also with a view to give an opportunity to the petitioners to reform themselves, this Court is inclined to grant pre-arrest bail to the petitioners. Accordingly, pre-arrest bail is granted to the petitioners subject to the following conditions:

(i) The petitioners shall be released on bail in the event of their arrest or in the event of their surrender before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Thiruppuvanam, within a period of 15 days from the date on which the order copy is made ready, on



executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) each along with two sureties each for a like sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) to the satisfaction of the the learned Judicial Magistrate, Thiruppuvanam.

(ii) The sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the Application for Suretyship [Judicial Form No.46 annexed to 'The Criminal Rules of Practice, 2019']. The learned Judicial Magistrate, Thiruppuvanam shall obtain a copy of any one identity proof of each surety to ensure their identity.

(iii) The petitioners shall appear and sign before the respondent-police weekly twice ie., on every Sunday and Monday at 10.00 am until further orders.

(iv) The petitioners shall make themselves available for interrogation by police as and when required.

(v) The petitioners shall not, directly or indirectly, make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade them from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer.

(vi) The petitioners shall also not directly or indirectly cause any threat to the defacto complainant and witnesses and tamper with evidence.

(vii) The petitioners shall not leave India without prior permission of the Court.

(viii) The petitioners shall furnish their residential address and mobile number to the learned Judicial Magistrate, Thiruppuvanam.

(ix) On breach of any of the aforementioned conditions, the learned Judicial Magistrate, Thiruppuvanam, or Trial Judge, as the case may be, is entitled to pass appropriate orders against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the aforementioned conditions are imposed by them as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in *P.K. Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005) 13 SCC 283]*.



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8. Accordingly, this Criminal Original Petition is allowed subject to the conditions stated supra.
