PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.482 of BNSS

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.418 of 2025 on the file of the respondent police.

ORDER: The Court made the following order :-

The petitioners / Accused Nos.1 & 2, who apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under sections 191(1), 296(b), 118 (1), 329(4), 351(3) and 129(2) in Crime No.418 of 2025, on the file of the respondent police, seek anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that due to land dispute between the petitioners and the defacto complainant, the petitioners along with other accused persons, trespassed into the defacto complainant's property and abused him in filthy language. When the workers of the defacto complainant questioned the same, the petitioners attacked them with wooden logs. Hence, the complaint.

3. The learned Counsel for the petitioners would submit that the petitioners are innocent person and they have not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution and that they have been falsely implicated in this case. He therefore prays for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) appearing for the respondent police would submit that it is a case of case in counter. He further submits that due to a wordy quarrel, the petitioners attacked the workers of the defacto complainant and caused injuries. However, the injured person was discharged from the hospital, and no previous case is pending against the

petitioners.

5. Considering the nature of allegation in this case that the occurrence arose due to a wordy quarrel between the petitioners and the defacto complainant, the petitioners are said to have attacked the workers of the defacto complainant and that it is a case and counter and also considering the fact that the injured was discharged from the hospital, this Court is inclined to enlarge the petitioners on anticipatory bail with certain conditions.

6. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on anticipatory bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date on which the order copy made ready, before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Srirangam, Trichy, on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) each with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed and on further condition that:

[a] the petitioners and the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank Pass Book to ensure their identity.

[b] the petitioners shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m.

until further orders.

[c] the petitioners shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[d] the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court themselves as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].

[f] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 of BNS 2023.
