ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

WEB COPY The petitioner/A1, who apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 406, 465, 471, 420, 448 and 506(i) of IPC, in Crime No.12 of 2024 on the file of the respondent police, seeks anticipatory bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that the defacto complainant is working as a consulting team lead in 1.Tong Resources Sdvi, 2.Leetian Trading Son, Bad, 3.YKY Resources BHD SDN-BHD outsourcing company. The petitioners and other accused were working as employees in the defacto complainant's outsourcing company. During the month of March, 2023, the petitioner and other accused persons illegally created fake pay slips to various persons and swindled the amount to the tune of Rs.4,68,32,975/-. Hence, a case was registered.

WEB COPY 3. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is an innocent person and she has not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution. He, however, submitted that the petitioner is willing to abide by any conditions that may be imposed by this Court. Hence, he seeks anticipatory bail.

4. The learned Additional Public Prosecutor submitted that there are no previous cases pending against the petitioner. However, he opposed to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

5. Taking into consideration of the facts and circumstances of the case, the nature of the offence and there are no previous cases pending against the petitioner, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner, with

6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned Judicial Magistrate Court No.II, Ramanathapuram, on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate Court No.II, Ramanathapuram, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed and on further condition that:

(a) the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression

in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

(b) the petitioner shall furnish his residential address and mobile number to the learned Judicial Magistrate Court No.II, Ramanathapuram. In the event of any change in his residential address, the petitioner shall report the same to the learned Judicial Magistrate Court No.II, Ramanathapuram;

(c) the petitioner shall report before the respondent Police Every Sunday at 10.30 a.m., for a period of two weeks and thereafter, as and when required for interrogation and cooperate with the investigation;

(d) the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation

or trial;

(e) the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(f) on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in *P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]* and;

(g) if the accused/petitioner thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 of BNS, 2023.
