PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.482 of BNSS

PRAYER:-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.163 of 2025 on the file of the Respondent Police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioner, who apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 296(b), 125, 115(2), 118(1) and 351(3) of BNS, 2023 in Crime No.163 of 2025 on the file of the respondent police, seeks anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that there was a matrimonial dispute between the petitioner and his wife, due to which the wife consumed poison and admitted in the Government Hospital. When it was, later, brought to the knowledge of the de-facto complainant, who is the father of the petitioner's wife, the de-facto complainant went to visit his daughter at the hospital. Thereafter, the petitioner unlawfully entered the premises of the de-facto complainant and assaulted him and abused him in filthy language and also threatened him with dire consequences, if he come to visit his daughter. Hence, the case.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is an innocent person, and is no way connected with the alleged occurrence as stated by the prosecution, and has been falsely implicated in this case. Hence, he seeks anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

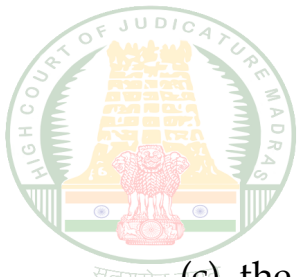
4. The learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) submitted that the injured has been discharged from the hospital, and there is no previous case against the petitioner.

5. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, and taking into account of the fact that injured has been discharged from the hospital, and also considering the fact that there is no previous case against the petitioner, this Court is inclined to enlarge the petitioner on anticipatory bail.

6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of his arrest or on his appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Melur on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent Police or to the Police Officer, who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate, Melur and on further conditions that:

(a) the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

(b) the petitioner shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m., until further orders;

सत्यमेव जयते (c) the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during
WEB COPY investigation or trial;

(d) the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(e) on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in *P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]*; and;

(f) if the accused thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 of BNS.
