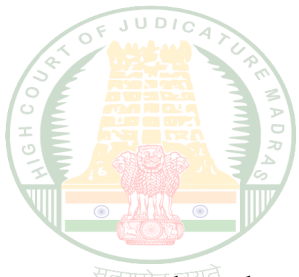
PETITION FOR BAIL Under Sec.483 of BNSS

ORDER : This Court made the following order :-

The petitioner / Accused, who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody
on 04.04.2025 for the offences punishable under Sections 4(1)(C), 4(1)(A) of

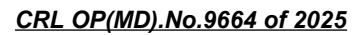
2. The case of the prosecution is that on 04.04.2025, at about 09.00hrs, the respondent police was in patrolling duty, at that time, they found that the petitioner herein was in illegal possession of 22 bottles of brandy each measuring 180ml along with cash of Rs.2,100/-. Hence, the case.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner is an innocent person and he has not committed any offences as alleged by the prosecution. The petitioner is ready and willing to abide any conditions that may be imposed by this Court. He would further submit that the petitioner is in custody from 04.04.2025 nearly 68 days. Hence, he seeks bail.

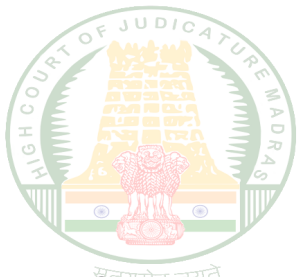
4. The learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) would submit that the respondent police found the petitioner in illegal possession of 22 bottles of brandy each measuring 180ml. The respondent police recovered the brandy bottles and recovered a sum Rs.2,100/- from the petitioner. This petitioner is having eighteen previous cases, all are similar in nature. However, he objected to grant bail to the petitioner.

5. Taking into consideration of the facts and circumstances of the case and also taking note of the fact that the contraband were seized by the respondent police,

[f] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial



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Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].

[g] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 BNS.
