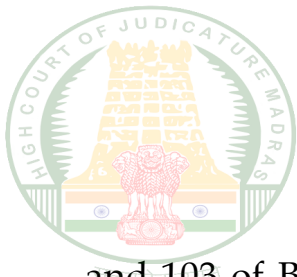

PETITION FOR BAIL Under Sec.483 of BNSS

PRAYER :- For Bail in Cr.No.178 of 2025 on the file of the respondent police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioner/ Accused, who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody
on 05.04.2025 for the alleged offences under sections 296(b), 115(2), 109(1), 296(b)

and 103 of BNS, 2023 in Crime No.178 of 2025 on the file of the respondent police

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seeks bail

2. The case of the prosecution is that there was a matrimonial dispute between the deceased and his wife and that the deceased went to his mother-in-law's house to ask the document of the Sridhana house and two sovereigns of gold and and that time, the accused, who is the brother-in-law of the deceased, splashed chilli powder on the deceased and also attacked the deceased with spade and thereby, caused death of the deceased. Hence, the case.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner is an innocent person and he has not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution. He would further submit that the petitioner is in judicial custody from 05.04.2025 and hence, he seeks bail.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Crl. side) appearing for the respondent – Police submitted that the petitioner is brother – in – law of the deceased and that there is no previous case pending against the petitioner. He further submitted that the deceased was died after 3 days of treatment and the investigation of the case is pending and hence, he opposed to grant bail to the petitioner.

5. Taking into consideration the facts and circumstances of the case and also the fact that there was a matrimonial dispute between the deceased and his wife and

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that there is no previous case pending against the petitioner and also taking into consideration of the fact that the petitioner is in judicial custody from 05.04.2025, this court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner, subject to the certain conditions.

6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on his executing a bond for Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand only) along with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate No.III, Thoothukudi and on further conditions that :-

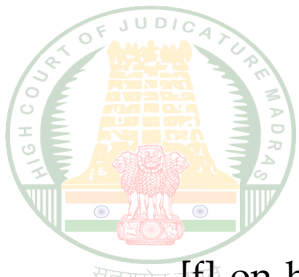
[a] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

[b] the petitioner shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.00 am until further orders;

[c] the petitioner shall submit his residential address and contact number to the learned Judicial Magistrate No.III, Thoothukudi. If he changes the residence, he shall inform the same to the concerned Magistrate without fail.

[d] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

[e] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

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[f] on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560]; and

[g] if the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 of BNS, 2023.
