PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.482 of BNSS

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.147 of 2025 on the file of the Respondent Police.
(Crime number and the offences have been amended vide Court order dated
29.07.2025 in Crl.M.P.(MD)No.9840 of 2025 in Crl.O.P.(MD)No.11722 of 2025 by
PVMJ)



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ORDER: The Court made the following order :-

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The petitioners/A1 & A2, who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 49, 296(b), 115(2) and 351(3) of BNS, 2023 in Crime No.147 of 2025 on the file of the respondent police, seek anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that due to previous civil dispute between the accused and the de-facto complainant, the accused attacked the de-facto complainant using hands. Hence, the present case has been registered.

3. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners are innocent persons and are in no way connected with the alleged occurrence as stated by the prosecution. They have been falsely implicated in this case. He, however, submitted that the petitioners are willing to abide by any conditions that may be imposed by this Court. Hence, he seeks anticipatory bail for the petitioners.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Crl. side) submitted that there are totally two accused persons in this case. There are no previous cases registered against the petitioners. He further submitted that no one sustained any injuries due to the incident. However, he opposed to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

5. Taking into consideration of the facts and circumstances of the case, the



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nature of the offence, and also taking note of the fact that no one sustained any injuries due to the incident, and that there are no previous cases registered against the petitioner, and that as the date of registration of FIR is 03.07.2025, by this time most of the investigation might have been completed, this court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners, subject to certain conditions.

6. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned Judicial Magistrate No.1, Ramanathapuram on condition that the petitioners shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) each with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate No.1, Ramanathapuram, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed and on further condition that:

(a) the petitioners and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

(b) the petitioners shall furnish their residential address and mobile number to the learned Judicial Magistrate No.1, Ramanathapuram. In the event of any change



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in their residential address, the petitioners shall report the same to the learned
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Judicial Magistrate No.1, Ramanathapuram;

(c) the petitioners shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m.
until further orders;

(d) the petitioners shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during
investigation or trial;

(e) the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(f) on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial
Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance
with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners released on bail
by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court themselves as laid down by the Hon'ble
Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560] and;

(g) if the accused/petitioners thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered
under Section 269 of BNS, 2023.
