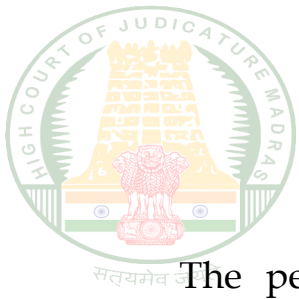

PETITION FOR BAIL Under Sec.483 of BNSS

PRAYER :- For Bail in Crime No.97 of 2025 on the file of the Respondent Police.

ORDER :- The Court made the following order :-



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The petitioner, who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 26.05.2025 for the offences punishable under Sections 103(1) BNS, in Crime No.97 of 2025 on the file of the respondent police, seeks bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that the defacto complainant is the son of the deceased and he was maintaining cows and staying at his cowshed. Subsequently, on 25.05.2025 at about 11.00 p.m., the defacto complainant and his relative were going to the cow shed and heard the screaming sound of the deceased, at that time, the petitioner attacked the deceased with wooden log on his head and caused death. Hence, the complaint.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is an innocent person and he has not committed any offences as alleged by the prosecution. He further submitted that there is no previous case pending against the petitioner and he is ready and willing to abide by any conditions which may be imposed by this Court. Hence, he seeks bail to the petitioner.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) submitted that the deceased had encroached on some land and maintained the cattle near the petitioner's land. He further submitted that there was a previous motive, the



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petitioner had consumed liquor and attacked the deceased with wooden log. He further submitted that the investigation is almost completed and there is no previous case pending against the petitioner. However, he opposed for grant of bail to the petitioner.

5. Taking into consideration of the facts and circumstances of the case and also the fact that the investigation has been almost completed and there is no previous case pending against the petitioner and also taking into consideration of the period of incarceration suffered by the petitioner, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner, subject to the following conditions:

6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on executing a bond for a sum of Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand only) with two sureties, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate, Paramakudi, and on further conditions that :-

[a] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity.



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[b] The petitioner shall furnish his residential address and mobile number to the learned Judicial Magistrate, Paramakudi.

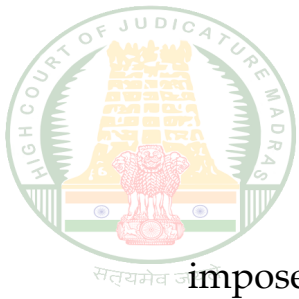
© If the petitioner changes his residential address, he shall report the same to the learned Judicial Magistrate, Paramakudi.

[d] the petitioner shall stay at Madurai and report before the Inspector of Police, Thideer Nagar Police Station, daily at 10.00 a.m., and 05.00 p.m., until further orders.

[e] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[f] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[g] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been



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imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].

[h] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 BNS.
