PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.482 of BNSS

**PRAYER :- For Anticipatory Bail in S.C.No.83 of 2023 on the file of the learned
Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate Court, Madurai, in Crime No.227 of 2022.**



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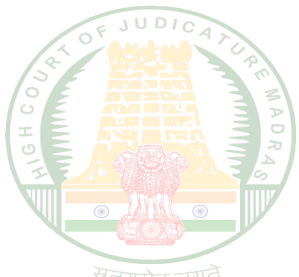
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ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioner, who apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 147, 148, 294(b), 324, 307 of IPC in S.C.No.83 of 2023 on the file of the learned Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate Court, Madurai, in Crime No.227 of 2022 on the file of the respondent police, seeks anticipatory bail.

2. The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is an innocent person and he has not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution. After the respondent police has completed the investigation and filed a charge sheet and the same was taken on file in S.C.No.83 of 2023 on the file of the learned Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate Court Madurai. He further submitted that the petitioner was not appear before the trial Court on 16.06.2025. Hence, Non-bailable warrant was issued against the petitioner. He further submits that the petitioner undertakes that he will not abscond and he will regularly appear before the Trial Court on hearing dates without fail. He further submitted that the petitioner is ready and willing to abide by any stringent conditions that may be imposed by this Court. Hence, he seeks anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

3. The learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) submitted that there are five previous cases pending against the petitioner and he was failed to appear before



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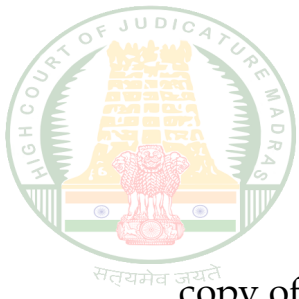
the concerned Magistrate and hence NBW was issued against the petitioner. He further submitted that the investigation has been completed and the charge sheet has also been filed. However, he opposed for grant of anticipatory anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

4. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case and also the fact that the investigation has been completed and the charge sheet has also been filed and also considering the undertaking given by the learned counsel for the petitioner, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner, subject to certain conditions.

5. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of his arrest or on his appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Madurai, on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand only) with two sureties, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent Police or to the Police Officer, who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Madurai, and on further conditions that:

(a) the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and

left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a



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copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

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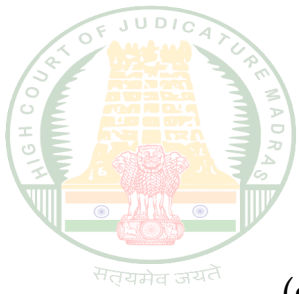
(b) the petitioner shall furnish his residential address and mobile number to the learned Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Madurai. In the event of any change in his residential address, the petitioner shall report the same to the learned Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Madurai.

(c) the petitioner shall report before the trial Court ie., the learned Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Madurai daily at 10.00 a.m., until further orders.

(d) the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

(e) the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(f) on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in *P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala* [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]; and;



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(g) if the accused thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered
under Section 269 of BNS, 2023.
