PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.482 of BNSS

PRAYER :- For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.270 of 2025 on the file of the Respondent Police.

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ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioner, who apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 296(b), 109, 351(3) of BNS, in Crime No.270 of 2025 on the file of the respondent police, seeks anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that there was a previous enmity between the accused persons and the defacto complainant, as a result of which on 10.06.2025 evening while the defacto complainant went to TASMACH shop at Kothaimangalam, the accused with intent to cause death attacked him and fled away and then on 10.06.2025 at 6.30 a.m., while the defacto complainant went to tea shop in his two wheeler, the accused came in another two wheeler and with intent to cause death voluntarily with his vehicle and caused simple injuries, at that time, the accused abused him in filthy language and threatened him with dire consequences. Hence, the complaint.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is an innocent person and he has not committed any offences as alleged by the prosecution. He further submitted that co-accused/A1 had already been arrested and thereafter, he was released on bail by the Principal Sessions Judge, Dindigul in Crl.M.P.No.1460 of 2025 dated 23.07.2025 and A3, A4 have already been granted

anticipatory bail by the Principal Sessions Judge, Dindigul in CrI.M.P.No.1457 of 2025 dated 23.07.2025. He further submitted that the petitioner is ready and willing to abide by any conditions which may be imposed by this Court. Hence, he seeks anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) submitted that no one was sustained injuries and the investigation is almost completed. He further submitted that there is no previous case pending against the petitioner. However, he opposed for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

5. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case and also the fact that no one was sustained injuries and co-accused had already been granted bail by the Principal Sessions Judge, Dindigul and the investigation is almost completed and there is no previous case pending against the petitioner, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner, subject to certain conditions.

6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of his arrest or on his appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the Judicial Magistrate Court, Palani, Dindigul District, on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent Police or to the Police Officer, who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction

of the Judicial Magistrate Court, Palani, Dindigul District, and on further conditions
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that:

(a) the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

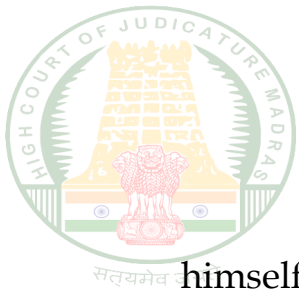
(b) the petitioner shall furnish his residential address and mobile number to the Judicial Magistrate Court, Palani, Dindigul District. In the event of any change in his residential address, the petitioner shall report the same to the Judicial Magistrate Court, Palani, Dindigul.

(c) the petitioner shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m., until further orders.

(d) the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

(e) the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(f) on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court

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himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]; and;

(g) if the accused thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 of BNS, 2023.
