PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.482 of BNSS



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PRAYER :-

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For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.28 of 2025 on the file of the Respondent Police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioners/A1 & A3, who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 498(A), 506(i) and 34 of IPC in Crime No.28 of 2025 on the file of the respondent police, seek anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that the 1st petitioner and the de-facto complainant are husband and wife. The 2nd petitioner is the mother-in-law of the de-facto complainant. The 1st petitioner is said to have illegal intimacy with the 2nd accused, and the 2nd petitioner did not care about the act of the 1st petitioner even it was informed to her by the de-facto complainant. Hence, the present case has been registered.

3. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioners submitted that in fact, the 2nd accused is a widow whose husband, is an employee of TNSCTC and a close friend of the 1st petitioner, passed away three years ago. The 2nd accused applied for



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appointment on compassionate grounds and sought the assistance of the 1st petitioner in securing a job in TNSTC. In order to help her, as her husband had been his close friend, the 1st petitioner extended his support. Knowing these facts, the de-facto complainant, on her own imagination, began to blame the 1st petitioner. He submitted that the petitioners are innocent persons and have not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution. They have been falsely implicated in this case. He, however, submitted that the petitioners are willing to abide by any conditions that may be imposed by this Court. Hence, he seeks anticipatory bail for the petitioners.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Crl. side) submitted that there are totally four accused persons in this case and the petitioners have been arrayed as A1 and A3. A2 and A4 are still absconding. No one sustained any injuries due to the incident. He further submitted that there are no previous cases registered against the petitioners. However, he opposed to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

5. Taking into consideration of the facts and circumstances of the case, the nature of the offence, and also taking note of the fact that no one sustained any injuries due to the incident, and that there are no previous cases registered against

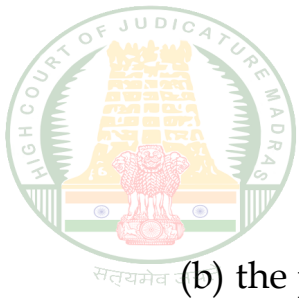


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the petitioners, and that as the date of registration of FIR is 29.07.2025, by this time material part of the investigation might have been completed, and that as the issue pertains to a matrimonial dispute, custodial interrogation of the petitioners is not necessary, this court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners, subject to certain conditions.

6. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date on which the order copy made ready, before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Bodinayankannur, Theni District on condition that the petitioners shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) each, with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate, Bodinayankannur, Theni District, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed and on further condition that:

(a) the petitioners and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;



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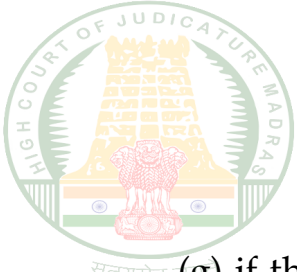
(b) the petitioners shall furnish their residential address and mobile number to the learned Judicial Magistrate, Bodinayankannur, Theni District. In the event of any change in their residential address, the petitioners shall report the same to the learned Judicial Magistrate, Bodinayankannur, Theni District;

(c) the petitioners shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m. until further orders;

(d) the petitioners shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

(e) the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(f) on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court themselves as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in *P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]* and;



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(g) if the accused/petitioners thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered
under Section 269 of BNS, 2023.
