PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Section 482 B.N.S.S.

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.246 of 2025 on the file of the Respondent Police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioners/ Accused No.2 and 4, who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 296(b), 115(2), 118(1) and 351(3) BNS, 2023 in Crime No.246 of 2025 on the file of the respondent police, seek anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that due to money dispute, on 21.06.2025, the petitioners along with other accused had abused the defacto complainant's brother-in-law in filthy language and attacked him with wooden log and when the defacto complainant's husband tried to prevent the same, they also attacked him by using aruval and also threatened them with dire consequences. Hence, the case.

3. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioners would submit that the petitioners are innocent persons and they have not committed any offences as alleged by the prosecution and that the petitioners are no way connected with the case, a false case has been lodged against the petitioners. He would further submit that the petitioners are ready and willing to abide any conditions which may be imposed by this Hon'ble Court. Hence, he seeks anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) appearing for the respondent police would submit that there are totally four accused, the petitioners arrayed as A2 and A4 and due to money dispute, the petitioners along with other accused attacked the defacto complainant's husband and brother-in-law and threatened them. He would further submit that the first accused was already arrested and released on bail by the learned Principal District and Sessions Judge, Tiruchirappalli in Crl. M.P.No.2673 of 2025 vide order dated 21.07.2025 and the third accused was granted anticipatory bail by the learned Principal District and Sessions Judge, Tiruchirappalli in Crl.M.P.No.3164 of 2025 vide order dated 31.07.2025, that the injured were discharged from the hospital and that the petitioners are not having any previous cases. However, he opposed to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

5. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, and also considering the facts that the first accused was released on bail and the third accused was granted anticipatory bail, that the injured were discharged from the hospital and that the petitioners are not having any previous cases and taking note of the fact that by this time, most of the investigation might have been completed, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners, subject to certain conditions.

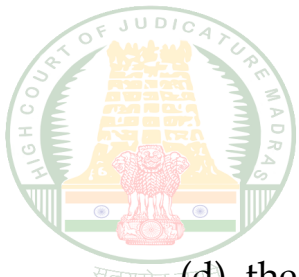

6. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on anticipatory bail in the event of their arrest or on their appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the Judicial Magistrate No.V, Trichy on condition that the petitioners shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand only) each with two sureties, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent Police or to the Police Officer, who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the Judicial Magistrate No.V, Trichy and on further conditions that:

(a) the petitioners and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

(b) the petitioners shall furnish their residential address and contact number to the learned Judicial Magistrate No.V, Trichy. In the event of any change in their residential address, the petitioners shall report the same to the learned Judicial Magistrate No.V, Trichy;

(c) the petitioners shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m., until further orders;

(d) the petitioners shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

(e) the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(f) on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]; and;

(g) if the accused thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 of BNS, 2023.
