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PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.482 of BNSS

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.413 of 2025 on the file of the Respondent Police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioners/A1 to A4, who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 296(b), 115(2) and 324 (4) of BNS, 2023 r/w. Section 4 of Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Harassment of Women Act, 2002 in Crime No.413 of 2025 on the file of the respondent police, seek anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that on 02.08.2025, when the waste water of the de-facto complainant's house reached the petitioners' house, a quarrel ensued between the petitioners and the de-facto complainant. It is alleged that the petitioners abused the de-facto complainant and also assaulted her. Hence, the present case was registered.

3. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioners submitted that it is a case, case in counter. A counter case has also been registered against the de-facto



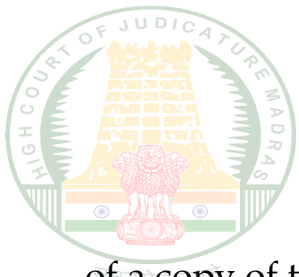
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complainant in Crime No.414 of 2025 on the file of the respondent police. The
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petitioners are innocent persons and have not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution. However, the petitioners are willing to abide by any conditions that may be imposed by this Court. Hence, he seeks anticipatory bail for the petitioners.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Crl. side) submitted that it is a case, case in counter. There are totally four accused persons in this case, and that there are no previous cases registered against the petitioners. He further submitted that the injured has been discharged from the hospital. However, he opposed to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

5. Taking into consideration of the facts and circumstances of the case, the nature of the offence, and also taking note of the fact that this is a case, case in counter, and that there are no previous cases registered against the petitioners, and that the injured has already been discharged from the hospital, this court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners, subject to certain conditions.

6. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt



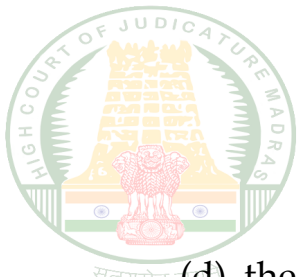
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of a copy of this order, before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Musiri, Trichy District,
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on condition that the petitioners shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/-
(Rupees Ten Thousand only) each with two sureties each for a like sum to the
satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest or to
the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate, Musiri, Trichy District, failing
which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed and on further
condition that:

(a) the petitioners and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb
impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar
card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

(b) the petitioners shall furnish their residential address and mobile number to
the learned Judicial Magistrate, Musiri, Trichy District. In the event of any change in
their residential address, the petitioners shall report the same to the learned Judicial
Magistrate, Musiri, Trichy District;

(c) the petitioners report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m. until
further orders;



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सत्यमेव जयते (d) the petitioners shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during
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(e) the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(f) on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court themselves as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in *P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]* and;

(g) if the accused/petitioners thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 of BNS, 2023.
