PETITION FOR BAIL Under Sec.483 of BNSS

PRAYER :- For Bail in Crime No.628 of 2024 on the file of the Respondent Police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioner, who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on
22.06.2025 for the offences punishable under Sections 406 & 420 of IPC, in Crime



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No.628 of 2024 on the file of the respondent police, seeks bail.

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2. The case of the prosecution is that the defacto complainant is neighbour of the accused and she is a physically challenged person. Further, the petitioner told the de facto complainant that the Government issued a house plot to her at a subsidised rate. Further, the petitioner assured to give a house plot to the defacto complainant. On believing the false promise given by the accused, the de facto complainant gave jewels and cash to a total value of Rs. 8 lakhs. Further, the petitioner neither registered a plot nor returned the money. Hence, the complain

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is an innocent person and she has not committed any offences as alleged by the prosecution. He further submitted that the petitioner is ready and willing to abide by any conditions which may be imposed by this Court. He further submitted that the petitioner is in judicial custody from 22.06.2025. Hence, he seeks bail to the petitioner.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) submitted that the petitioner has cheated the defacto complainant to the tune of Rs.8 Lakhs. He further submitted that there is no previous case pending against the petitioner and the investigation is almost completed. However, he opposed for grant of bail to the



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petitioner.

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5. Taking into consideration of the facts and circumstances of the case and also the fact that the investigation has been almost completed and also consideration the period of incarceration suffered by the petitioner, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner, subject to the following conditions:

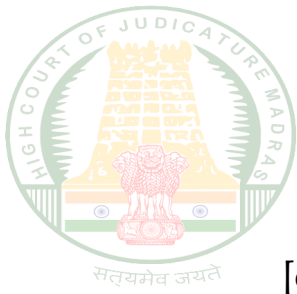
6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the Judicial Magistrate No.I, Dindigul, and on further conditions that :-

[a] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity.

[b] The petitioner shall furnish her residential address and mobile number to the Judicial Magistrate No.I, Dindigul.

(c) If the petitioner changes her residential address, she shall report the same to the Judicial Magistrate No.I, Dindigul.

[d] the petitioner shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m., until further orders.



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trial.

[e] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or

[f] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[g] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].

[h] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 BNS.
