PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.482 of BNSS.

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.105 of 2025 on the file of the Respondent Police.

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ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

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The petitioner, who apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 296(b), 118(1), 351(3), 303(2) of BNS and Section 4 of Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Harassment of Women Act, 2002, in Crime No.105 of 2025 on the file of the respondent police, seeks anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that on 30.06.2025 at about 7.00 am., the petitioner along with other accused persons have entered into the land of the defacto complainant and quarrel with her, as a result of which, the petitioner along with other accused persons had attacked the defacto complainant with Aruval and iron rod and caused injuries. Hence, the complaint.

3. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is an innocent person and has not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution. He further submitted that there was a civil dispute pending between them in O.S.No.38 of 2023 before the District Munsif Court, Ponnamaravathi. He further submitted that the petitioner has given a complaint before the respondent police against the defacto complainant in Crime No.106 of 2025. He further submitted that the petitioner is ready and willing to abide by any stringent conditions which may be imposed by this Court. Hence, he seeks anticipatory bail to the petitioner.



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4. The learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) submitted that the injured person has been discharged from the hospital and the investigation is almost completed. However, he opposed to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

5. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case and also the fact that the injured person has been discharged from the hospital and also the investigation is almost completed, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner, subject to certain conditions.

6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of her arrest or on her appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the Judicial Magistrate, Ponnamaravathi, on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand only) with two sureties, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent Police or to the Police Officer, who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the Judicial Magistrate, Ponnamaravathi, and on further conditions that:

- (a) the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of her Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;



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(b) the petitioner shall furnish her residential address and mobile number to the Judicial Magistrate, Ponnamaravathi. In the event of any change in her residential address, the petitioner shall report the same to the Judicial Magistrate, Ponnamaravathi;

(c) the petitioner shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m., until further orders;

(d) the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

(e) the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(f) on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]; and;



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(g) if the accused thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 of BNS, 2023.
