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PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.482 of BNSS

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PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.444 of 2025 on the file of the Respondent Police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioners, who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 115(2), 118(1)/ r/w.61(2) of BNS in Crime No.444 of 2025, on the file of the respondent police, seek anticipatory bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that there are some previous motive regarding some relationship between the defacto complainant and the 4th petitioner herein. Due to which the petitioners have conspired together and attacked the defacto complainant by using knife and hands. Hence, the case.

3. The learned Counsel for the petitioner would submit that due to some previous motive, the defacto complainant lodged a false allegation as against the petitioner and the petitioners are having permanent abode. Hence, he seeks anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) would submit that there



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are some previous motive regarding some relationship between the defacto complainant and the 4th petitioner herein. Due to which the petitioners have conspired together and attacked the defacto complainant by using knife and hands. However, he opposed to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

5. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners, subject to certain conditions:-

6. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on anticipatory bail in the event of his arrest or on his appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned Judicial Magistrate No.VI, Madurai, on condition that the petitioners shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) each with two sureties, for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent Police or to the Police Officer, who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate No.VI, Madurai, and on further conditions that:

(a) the petitioners and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

(b) the petitioners shall furnish their residential address and contact number to the learned Judicial Magistrate No.VI, Madurai. In



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the event of any change in their residential address, the petitioners shall report the same to the learned Judicial Magistrate No.VI, Madurai.

(c) the 1st petitioner shall appear and sign before the Inspector of Police, Dindigul Town North Police, Station, Dindigul, daily at 10.30 a.m. and thereafter, he shall appear before the respondent police as and when required for interrogation;

(d) the 2nd, 3rd and 4th petitioners shall appear and sign before the Inspector of Police, Avaniyapuram Police Station, Madurai City, daily at 10.30.a.m. and thereafter, they shall appear before the respondent police as and when required for interrogation;

(e) the petitioners shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

(f) the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(g) on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in *P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala* [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]; and;

(h) if the accused thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 of BNS, 2023.
