Prayer : This Transfer Civil Miscellaneous Petition filed under Section 24 C.P.C., to withdraw the H.M.O.P.No.4129 of 2024 on the file of the Family Court, Chennai and transfer the same to the Family Court, Karaikudi.

ORDER

The Transfer Civil Miscellaneous Petition is filed to withdraw the case on the file of the Family Court, Chennai, in H.M.O.P.No.4129 of



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2024 and transfer the same to the file of the Family Court, Karaikudi.
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2. Heard the learned counsel on either side.

3. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner in the petition as well as in the affidavit has sought for transfer from the Family Court, Chennai to the Family Court, Karaikudi but would say that the case may be transferred to the Subordinate Court, Devakottai, as there is no Family Court at Karaikudi.

4. It is evident from the records that the marriage between the petitioner and the respondent was solemnized on 16.11.2007. It is not in dispute that the respondent has filed a petition in H.M.O.P.No.4129 of 2024 seeking divorce and the same is pending on the file of the Family Court, Chennai.

5. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner is now residing at Karaikudi, Sivagangai District and finds it difficult to travel from Karaikudi to Chennai to attend the hearings.



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6. The learned counsel appearing for the respondent would submit that they are not having any objection to transfer the case.

7. In the case of ***N.C.V.Aishwarya Vs. A.S.Saravana Karthik Sha*** reported in ***2022 Live Law (SC) 627***, the Hon'ble Supreme Court has reiterated the position with generally, it is the wife's convenience, which must be looked at while considering the transfer petition under Section 24 of the Code of Civil Procedure and the relevant passage is extracted hereunder :

“The cardinal principle for exercise of power under Section 24 of the Code of Civil Procedure is that the ends of justice should demand the transfer of the suit, appeal or other proceeding. In matrimonial matters, wherever Courts are called upon to consider the plea of transfer, the Courts have to take into consideration the economic soundness of both the parties, the social strata of the spouses and their behavioural pattern, their standard of life prior to the marriage and subsequent thereto and the circumstances of both the parties in eking out their livelihood and under whose protective umbrella they are seeking their sustenance to life. Given the prevailing socioeconomic paradigm in the Indian society, generally, it is the wife's convenience which must be looked at while considering transfer.”, the bench observed.”



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8. Considering the above facts and circumstances and also taking note of the submission made by the learned counsel appearing for the respondent, this Court is of the view that the case in H.M.O.P.No.4129 of 2024 is ordered to be withdrawn from the file of the Family Court, Chennai, and transfer the same to the file of the Subordinate Court, Devakottai. Accordingly, the learned IV Additional Principal Judge, Family Court, Chennai, is hereby directed to transmit the entire records in H.M.O.P.No.4129 of 2024 to the file of the Subordinate Court, Devakottai, within a period of 10 days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order and on receiving the case bundle, the learned Subordinate Judge, Devakottai, is directed to take up the petition on file and proceed in accordance with law.

9. With the above direction, the Transfer Civil Miscellaneous Petition stands allowed. Consequently, connected Miscellaneous Petition is closed. No costs.
