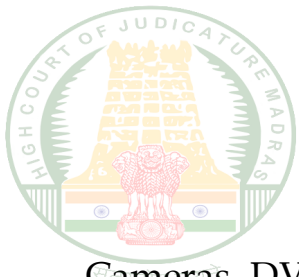
PETITION FOR BAIL Under Sec.483 of BNSS

PRAYER :- For Bail in Crime No.718 of 2024 on the file of the respondent police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioner, who was arrested and remanded to judicial custody on 27.06.2025 for the offences punishable under Sections 331(3), 331(4), 305(a) of BNS 2023 in Crime No.718 of 2024 on the file of the respondent police, seeks bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that this petitioner and other accused were broke open the door of the defacto-complainant's company and stolen the CCTV



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Cameras, DVR, Hard Disk and other materials worth about Rs.70,860/- . Hence, the
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complaint.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that there are totally two accused, this petitioner was arrayed as Accused No.1. This petitioner is an innocent person and he has not committed any offences as alleged by the prosecution. The petitioner is ready and willing to abide any conditions that may be imposed by this Court. He would further submit that the petitioner is in custody from 27.06.2025, nearly 74 days. Hence, he seeks bail.

4. The learned Additional Public Prosecutor submitted that on 16.12.2024 this petitioner and other accused were broke open the door of the defacto-complainant's company and stolen the CCTV Cameras, DVR, Hard Disk and other materials worth about Rs.70,860/-. The stolen properties not yet recovered. Since the petitioner is belongs to State of Rajasthan and consecutively he have committed similar kind offence on the same day. If the petitioner is released on bail, there will be a chance to absconding. In this case, investigation is still pending. Hence, he opposed for grant of bail to the petitioner.

5. Taking into consideration of the facts and circumstances of the case and also the fact that the occurrence was happened on 16.12.2024, the petitioner was arrested and remanded into judicial custody on 27.06.2025, at this time most of the



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investigation might have been completed and also considering the period of
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incarceration suffered by the petitioner, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the
petitioner, subject to the following conditions:

6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on executing a
bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties, each
for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate No.1, Tirunelveli,
and on further conditions that :-

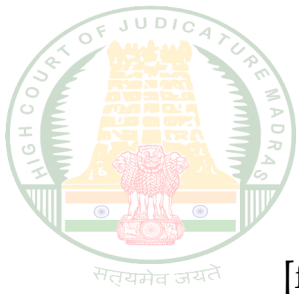
[a] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb
Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of
their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity.

[b] The petitioner shall furnish his residential address and mobile
number to the learned Judicial Magistrate No.1, Tirunelveli

[c] If the petitioner changes his residential address, she shall report
the same to the learned Judicial Magistrate No.1, Tirunelveli

[d] the petitioner shall report before the respondent police daily at
10.30 a.m., until further orders.

[e] the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or
trial.



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[f] the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[g] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].

[h] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 BNS.
