PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.482 of BNSS

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Cr.No.24 of 2025 on the file of the
respondent police.



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ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

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The petitioner/Accused, who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 63, 77, 74, 351(2) of BNS, 2023, in Crime No.24 of 2025, seeks anticipatory bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that the petitioner recorded a video of the defacto complainant while she was bathing and using the said video, coerced her into sexual intercourse and threatened to kill her husband and son if she revealed the incident. Unable to tolerate the petitioner's harassment, the defacto complainant took a decision to commit a suicide by consuming rat poison. Hence, the complaint . Hence, the complaint.

3. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submits that the petitioner is an innocent person and he has not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution. He further submitted that the petitioner has handed over all three phones. Hence, he prays for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners.



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4. The learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) appearing for the respondent Police submits that petitioner recorded a video of the defacto complainant while she was bathing and using the said video, coerced her into sexual intercourse and threatened to kill her husband and son if she revealed the incident. He further submitted that only two phones have been handed over. Therefore, he opposed for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

5. Taking into consideration of the facts and circumstances of the case and also considering the argument of the learned counsel for the petitioner that the petitioner is ready to abide by any stringent condition, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with certain conditions.

6. Accordingly, this Petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or his appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Thuraiyur, on condition



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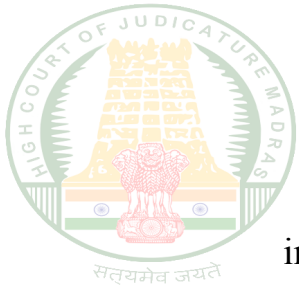
that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent Police or to the Police Officer, who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further conditions that:

(a) the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

(b) the petitioner shall do social service in the Mahatma Gandhi Memorial Government Hospital, Tiruchirappalli, daily from 10.00 a.m., to 4.00 p.m., for a period of two weeks and thereafter, report before the Inspector of Police, Cantonment Police Station, Trichy, daily evening at 6.00 p.m., until further orders. Any mobile phones in the petitioner's possession shall be surrendered to the respondent police.

(c) the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

(d) the petitioner shall not abscond either during



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investigation or trial;

(e) on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in *P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]*; and;

(f) if the accused thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 of BNS 2023.
