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ORDER

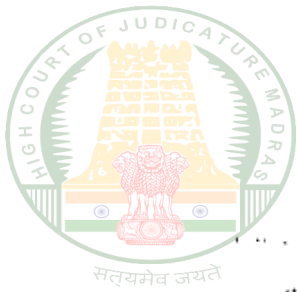
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This Criminal Original Petition is filed seeking to quash the FIR in Crime No.185 of 2025 on the file of the first respondent Police, which was registered for the offences under Sections 296(b), 115(2) of BNS r/w Section 4 of TNPHW Act.

2.The allegation in the FIR is that due to property dispute, the petitioners assaulted the defacto complainant and abused him in filthy language and thus, committed the aforesaid offences.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner and the learned counsel for the defacto complainant/the second respondent would submit that the parties have now entered into a compromise on the advise of the elders and well-wishers and both the parties have agreed that the impugned F.I.R may be quashed.

4.The parties have also filed a joint compromise memo. The scanned copy of the compromise memo reads as follows:

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JOINT COMPROMISE MEMO FILED BY BOTH PARTIES

1. It is submitted that on the basis of the complaint lodged by the 2nd respondent, a case has been registered against the petitioners in Crime No.185 of 2025 for the offenses under section 296(b),115(2) of BNS and section 4 of Tamilnadu Prohibition of harassment of Women Act,2002,on the file of the 1st respondent Police.

2. The 1st petitioner is none other than the younger brother of the 2nd respondent. The 2nd and 3rd petitioners are the wife and daughter of the 1st petitioner. Due to civil dispute relating to partition over ancestral properties, both 1st petitioner and the 2nd respondent were not in talking terms, which had resulted in the present incident. Since the 1st petitioner and the 2nd respondent are the brother and sister and due to the intervention of other family elders, they both have agreed to settle their dispute amicably. Accordingly, the petitioners and the 2nd respondent have entered into a compromise and agreed to close the criminal cases. As a result, the 2nd respondent has agreed to say no objection to close the prosecution initiated against the petitioners.

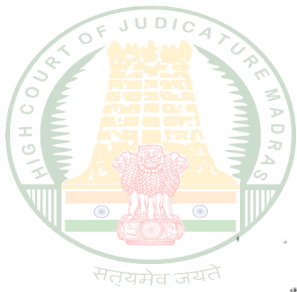
3. It is submitted that the offense mentioned in the FIR are simple in nature and not serious in nature and the offenses are compoundable. In view of the above compromise, the 2nd respondent has no objection to quash the FIR pending against the petitioners in Crime.No.185 of 2025 on the file of respondent police. Unless the above criminal case pending against the petitioners is quashed, the petitioners would be put into irreparable loss and severe hardship. If the further investigation and trial proceedings are allowed to continue in this case

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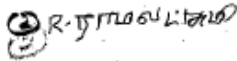
definitely that will not fetch any fruitful results because the defacto complainant has settled the dispute with the petitioners.

4. The nature of offences and dispute are simple in nature and that can be quashed in the light of judgment rendered by the Supreme Court in State of Madhya Pradesh v. Laxmi Narayan reported in (2019) 5 SCC 688 and (Parbathbhai Aahir @ Parbathbhai Vs. State of Gujrat) reported in (2017) 9 SCC 641. Under these circumstances, the FIR in Crime.No.185 of 2025 on the file of 1st respondent police may be quashed for the welfare of both parties.

It is therefore prayed that this Hon'ble Court may be pleased to accept this joint memo of compromise filed by the petitioners and the 2nd respondent and allow the present quash petition as prayed for and pass suitable orders and thus render justice.

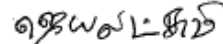

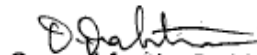

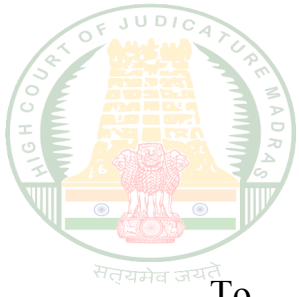
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5.The petitioners, namely, Ramasubramani @ Ramasubbiramani (Aadhaar No.4013 4815 0985), Ramalakshmi (Aadhaar No.5712 8655 2481), Lakshmi Priya (Aadhaar No.8495 1725 3566) and the second respondent, namely, Jayalakshmi (Aadhaar No.8147 2399 6364) are present before this Court in person. They are identified by Mr.P.Periyasamy, Special Sub Inspector of Police, Mallanginar Police Station, Virudhunagar District. All the parties confirmed the compromise arrived at between them.

6.Considering the nature of the offences and the fact that the parties have arrived at a compromise, this Court is of the view that no useful purpose would be served by keeping the impugned FIR pending investigation. Accordingly, the impugned FIR in Crime No.185 of 2025, on the file of the first respondent police, is quashed and the Criminal Original Petition stands allowed.
