punishable under Sections 103 of BNS @ 103, 191(2), 191(3), 190, 127(2), 61(2) and 49 of BNS, in Crime No.70 of 2025 on the file of the respondent police. seek bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that due to previous enmity, the petitioners and other accused persons murdered the defacto complainant's husband. Hence, the complaint.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners are innocent persons and they have not committed any offences as alleged by the prosecution. He further submitted that the petitioners are ready and willing to abide by any conditions which may be imposed by this Court and they are in judicial custody from 29.03.2025. Hence, he seeks bail to the petitioners.

4. The learned Additional Public Prosecutor submitted that the petitioners 1,2,3 &4 have no previous cases and the 5th petitioner/A1 has 18 previous cases and co-accused were already granted bail and the investigation has been completed. However, he opposed for grant of bail to the



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petitioners.

Taking into consideration of the facts and circumstances of the case and also the fact that the co-accused were already released on bail and there is no previous case pending against the petitioners 1,2,3 &4 , and also consideration the period of incarceration suffered by the petitioners, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioners 1,2,3 &4, subject to the following conditions:

6. Accordingly, the petitioners 1,2,3 &4 are ordered to be released on bail on executing a separate bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the Judicial Magistrate, Thirumangalam, Madurai, and on further conditions that :-

[a] the sureties shall affix their photographs and Left Thumb Impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;

[b] the petitioners 1,2,3 &4 shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m.,until further orders;



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[c] the petitioners 1,2,3 &4 shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

[d] the petitioners 1,2,3 &4 shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

[e] On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners 1,2,3 &4 in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners 1,2,3 &4 released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560];

[f] If the accused thereafter absconds, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 BNS.

7.As far as the fifth petitioner/A1 is concerned, this Court is not inclined to grant bail. Hence, this Criminal Original Petition is dismissed as against A1/5th petitioner.
