PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.482 of BNSS

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.9 of 2024 on the file of the
Respondent Police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioner, who apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 417, 420, 465, 468, 471 and 109 IPC in Crime No.9 of 2024 on the file of the respondent police, seeks anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that A3 and A4 are the brokers and they have informed the defacto complainant as if A1 and A2 are the owners of two plots and they have also created documents to that effect and that the petitioner / A5 came to show the site along with defacto complainant, A1 and A2 have received a sum of Rs.40,00,000/- from the defacto complainant. Later, it came to light that A1 and A2 are not the owners of the property and it was owned by some other person and it was also acquired by the Highways for which the original owner has received compensation. Hence, the complaint.

3. Heard the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner and the learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) appearing for the respondent police.

4. Considering the nature of allegation against the petitioner that he sold the property belonging to the National Highways to the defacto complainant and also considering the fact that the the co-accused has already been granted anticipatory bail by this Court in Crl.O.P(MD).No. 9309 of 2025, dated 11.06.2025 this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner, subject to certain conditions.

5. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance, on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate No.II, Pudukkottai within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order and on further conditions that:

[a]the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhaar card or bank pass book to ensure their identity;

[b] the petitioner shall report before the respondent Police daily at 10.30 am until further orders;

[c]the petitioner shall not tamper with the evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[d]the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[e]On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner is released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].
