PRAYER :-For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.49 of 2025 on the file of
the Respondent Police.

ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioners/Accused, who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 498(A), 294(b), 406, 506(i) of IPC, in Crime No.49 of 2025 on the file of the respondent police, seek anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that the 1st petitioner is the husband of the defacto complainant and others are the in-laws. Further, the petitioners had received some jewels and amounts from the defacto complainant and thereafter, the petitioners have not returned to her. Further, the petitioners had abused the defacto complainant in filthy language and threatened her with dire consequences. Hence the complaint.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners are innocent persons and they have not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution. He further submitted that due to family dispute, a false case has been given. He further submitted that the petitioners are willing to abide by any conditions that may be imposed by

this Court. Hence, he seeks anticipatory bail for the petitioners.

4. The learned Additional Public Prosecutor submitted that there is no previous case pending against the petitioners and no one was sustained injuries. However, he vehemently opposed to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

5. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case and also the fact that no one was sustained injuries., this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners, subject to certain conditions.

6. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance, on condition that each of the petitioner shall execute a separate bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties, each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Additional Mahila Judicial Magistrate Court, Srivilliputtur, Virudhunagar District, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order and on further conditions that:

[a]the petitioners and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhaar card or bank pass book to ensure their identity;

[b] the 1st petitioner shall report before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m., until further orders. The petitioners 2 and 3 shall report before the respondent police as and when required for interrogation.

[c]the petitioners shall not tamper with the evidence or witness either during investigation or trial.

[d]the petitioners shall not abscond either during investigation or trial.

[e]On breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioners in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioners are released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in P.K.Shaji vs. State of Kerala [(2005)AIR SCW 5560].
