PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec.482 of BNSS

PRAYER :-

For Anticipatory Bail in Crime No.123 of 2025 on the file of the Respondent Police.



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ORDER : The Court made the following order :-

The petitioner, who apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 304(2) BNS, 2023 in Crime No.123 of 2025, on the file of the respondent police, seeks anticipatory bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that on 17.10.2025 at about 12.00 noon, the defacto complainant along with salesman left the company after loading goods for delivery. They delivered goods and collected payments at various places and lastly at shops near the Tiruppathur Temple entrance, Tiruppathur Bus Stand and J.J. Bakery. By the end of the deliveries, they had collected a total cash amount of Rs.1,60,000/- and thereafter proceeded towards Madurai. While proceeding on the Tiruppathur-Madurai Road, two unidentified persons on a two-wheeler misled them stating that the rear door of the vehicle was open. When the complainant and salesman stopped and checked the vehicle near Vettankudipatti Nizam Wirenet Company, two unknown persons assaulted and pushed them, forcibly snatched the amount of Rs.1,60,000/- from the salesman and escaped. The complainant sustained injury on his left hand. Hence, the case.

3.The learned Counsel for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner is an innocent person and he has never committed in this case. Hence, he seeks anticipatory bail to the petitioner.



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4. The learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) would submit that A1 and A4 were released on bail and the petitioner is having no previous cases and also injured discharged from the hospital. However, he opposed to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

5. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on anticipatory bail in the event of his arrest or on his appearance, within a period of fifteen days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Singampunari, Sivagangai District, on condition that the petitioner shall execute a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties, for a like sum to the satisfaction of the respondent Police or to the Police Officer, who intends to arrest or to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate, Singampunari, Sivagangai District, and on further conditions that:

(a) the petitioner and the sureties shall affix their photographs and left thumb impression in the surety bond and the Magistrate may obtain a copy of their Aadhar card or Bank pass Book to ensure their identity;



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(b) the petitioner shall make deposit of **Rs.20,000/- (Rupees Twenty Thousand only)** to the credit of **Crime No.123 of 2025**, without prejudice to his defence before the trial Court; and on such deposit being made, the learned Judicial Magistrate, Singampunari, Sivagangai District, shall accept the sureties furnished by the petitioner; the learned Judicial Magistrate, Singampunari, Sivagangai District shall deposit the said amount as fixed deposit in a Nationalized Bank and the entitlement of the said amount will be decided at the time of disposal of the main case.

(c) the petitioner shall furnish his residential address and contact number to the learned Judicial Magistrate, Singampunari, Sivagangai District. In the event of any change in his residential address, the petitioner shall report the same to the learned Judicial Magistrate, Singampunari, Sivagangai District

(d) the petitioner shall appear before the respondent police, daily at 10.30 a.m., until further orders.

(e) the petitioner shall not tamper with evidence or witness either during investigation or trial;

(f) the petitioner shall not abscond either during investigation or trial;

(g) on breach of any of the aforesaid conditions, the learned Magistrate/ Trial Court is entitled to take appropriate action against the petitioner in accordance with law as if the conditions have been imposed and the petitioner released on bail by the learned Magistrate/Trial Court himself as laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in *P.K.Shaji Vs. State of Kerala [(2005) AIR SCW 5560]*; and;



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(h)if the accused thereafter abscond, a fresh FIR can be registered under Section 269 of BNS, 2023.
