1. Petitioner filed petition under Section 528 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 for directing respondents No. 2 to 4 for further investigation in FIR No. 0378 dated 25.09.2024 registered under Section 127(2), 3(5), 351(2), 65(1) of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023 registered at Police Station Sector 27, Sonipat, District Sonipat or to get investigation done from independent agency such as Central Bureau of Investigation with allegation that Investigating Agency is conniving with private respondents No. 5 to 7. Copy of FIR annexed with present petition is Annexure P-1 and representation given to Deputy Commissioner of Police, Sonipat dated 27.11.2024 is Annexure P-2.

2. Status report has been called for. It is pointed out that thorough investigation was carried out by police. Statements of witnesses were recorded. CCTV footage was perused. During investigation, no incriminating evidence was found to arrest any person on the allegations levelled by complainant. Accordingly, cancellation report was prepared

which is yet to be approved by the higher officer. Alongwith supplementary status report, MLR of victim is also annexed as Annexure R-1. Learned State counsel at the instance of Lady ASI Suman, No. 583/SPT stated that cancellation report is going to be presented before the Illaqa Magistrate.

3. I have considered the aforesaid factual position. In case, cancellation report is submitted before the Illaqa Magistrate, notice will be sent to complainant for proper adjudication of cancellation report. Apart from this, complainant has legal remedy available to her i.e, filing of protest petition. Considering the aforesaid factual position, learned counsel representing petitioner conceded that petitioner will avail appropriate legal remedy available to her as per law.

4. In view of aforesaid fact, no further direction is required and present petition is, accordingly, disposed of with liberty to petitioner to seek legal remedy available to her as per law.

5. Pending miscellaneous application, if any, shall also stands disposed of accordingly.
