SANJAY VASHISTH, J. (Oral)

1. By way of this common order, all the aforementioned three petitions are being disposed of, as they arise out of one common FIR.
2. Petitioners, namely Kuldeep, Sandeep, and Rohit, have filed petitions seeking regular bail in case FIR No. 271 dated 29.08.2019, under Section 346 IPC (Sections 364, 379-A, 307, 302, and 201 IPC were added later), registered at Police Station Civil Lines, Rohtak.

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3. At the very outset, learned State counsel submits that prosecution witnesses have already been examined.

4. In view of the stage of trial, as informed by learned State counsel, this Court refrains from entertaining the prayer for bail made by petitioners through the instant petitions. Accordingly, present petitions are disposed of, with a direction to learned trial Court to conclude the trial expeditiously, preferably within a period of three months from today.

5. However, it is made clear that if any application is filed by accused-petitioners herein, same shall be taken up on a day-to-day basis for disposal, so that it does not cause any hindrance during the final adjudication of the trial.

6. Petitions stand disposed of.
