MANJARI NEHRU KAUL, J. (ORAL)

1. The petitioner is seeking the concession of anticipatory bail, under Section 482 of BNSS, 2023, in FIR No.266, dated 20.12.2024, under Sections 318, 336, 338, 340, 61(2) of BNS, 2023, registered at Police Station City Moga, District Moga.

2. On the last date of hearing i.e. 21.01.2025, while noticing the following submissions made by the learned counsel for the petitioner, a coordinate Bench of this Court had granted the concession of interim bail to the petitioner and asked him to join investigation:-

“Counsel for the petitioner *inter alia* submits that the petitioner is bonafide purchaser of the land in question from co-accused Charanjit Kaur and Sukhwinder Singh for valuable consideration, without notice. The counsel for the petitioner further submits that the petitioner was not aware of any litigation, which was earlier going on between the complainant party and aforesaid Charanjit Kaur with regard to estate of Ram Singh (since deceased). It is further submitted that the

said civil litigation was later on withdrawn on the basis of compromise. Counsel for the petitioner further submits that the petitioner, who is having no criminal antecedents, is ready to join the investigation with the police.”

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that in compliance of order dated 21.01.2025, petitioner has joined investigation and cooperated with the investigating agency.

4. Learned State counsel, on instructions from Inspector Gurpreet Singh, does not dispute the factum of the petitioner having joined investigation and cooperated with the investigating agency. He, on further instructions, submits that the petitioner is not required for further investigation much less for his custodial interrogation.

5. In view of the above, the petition is allowed and interim order dated 21.01.2025, is made absolute subject to the conditions laid down in Section 438(2) Cr.P.C./482(2) of BNSS, 2023.
