Learned counsel for the respondent-Chandigarh Housing Board, while referring to a communication dated 28.04.2025, submits that the application of the petitioner for allotment of small flat under the Chandigarh Small Flats Scheme, 2006 on licence basis has been found favourable by the authorities.
