The instant petition has been preferred by the petitioner seeking issuance of an appropriate writ in the nature of Mandamus directing the respondents to release the interest on delayed payment in pension and pensionary benefits including gratuity, leave encashment, commutation to the petitioner @ 24% per annum.

2. At the very outset, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that, at this juncture, the petitioner would be satisfied in case the respondent No.2-Director, Sainik & Ardh Sainik Welfare Department, Haryana is directed to look into the demand/Legal Notice dated 01.11.2024 (Annexure P-5) as the grievance espoused by the petitioner therein and passed a

reasoned and speaking order thereupon in accordance with law and in a time bound manner.

3. Notice of motion.

4. On the asking of the Court, Ms. Tanisha Peshawaria, DAG, Haryana, who is present in Court, accepts notice on behalf of the respondents and submits that she has no objection to the aforesaid prayer being granted.

5. Accordingly, with the consent of the parties and without commenting upon the merits of the case, the present petition is disposed of and respondent No.2-Director, Sainik & Ardh Sainik Welfare Department, Haryana is directed to take note of the demand/Legal Notice dated 01.11.2024 (Annexure P-5) sent by the petitioner and to pass a reasoned and speaking order thereupon in accordance with law preferably within a period of four months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

6. Needless to mention that in the event the entitlement of the petitioner is established as per law, the payment due to the petitioner shall 100 be released expeditiously and preferably within a further period of two months.
