1. All the three petitions are taken up together for final disposal

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with the consent of learned counsel for the parties since all the three petitions arise out of the same FIR. The prayer in all three petitions is for the grant of anticipatory bail and interim relief in the form of stay of arrest has been granted to the petitioners.

2. All the three petitions have been filed under Section 482 of the BNSS, 2023 for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners in FIR No.0144 dated 06.11.2024 under Section 74, 115 (2), (Section 117(2) added later on), 194, 351(2), 191(3) and 190 of BNS, 2023, registered at Police Station City Samana, District Patiala, Punjab.

3. Learned counsels appearing on behalf of the petitioners submitted that it is a case where as per the allegations, the complainant who is a married lady and is residing at her parental house had set up a stall of fire crackers for selling but the petitioners had come to the location and damaged her fire crackers stall and thereafter started fighting with her and during the altercation one of the petitioners namely Harjeet Singh @ Johny, hit her with a stick. All the learned counsels submitted that in fact the present petitioners have been falsely implicated in the present case and the dispute was only with regard to setting up of a fire crackers stall. They further submitted that all the three petitioners have already joined the investigation and have fully cooperated with the investigation process and therefore they may be considered for the grant of anticipatory bail.

4. On the other hand, learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Puran Singh, submitted that all the three petitioners in all the three cases have already joined the investigation and have fully cooperated with

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the investigation process and they are not required for further custodial interrogation.

5. After hearing learned counsels for the parties and in view of the specific stand taken by the learned State counsel, all the three petitions are hereby allowed.

6. It is directed that in case in future the petitioners are required to join the investigation process then they shall join the investigation and cooperate fully with the investigation process. In the event of arrest, the petitioners shall be released on bail by the Arresting/Investigating Officer on their furnishing bail bonds/sureties to his satisfaction, subject to the conditions as provided under Section 482(2) of BNSS, 2023.
