The prayer in the present petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India is for seeking issuance of directions to respondent No.2 to protect the life and liberty of the petitioners at the hands of the private respondents. There is a further prayer that directions be issued to respondents No.5 and 7 not to harass the petitioners or call them to Police Station time and again.

2. The learned counsel for the petitioners, at the very outset, contends that it is a matrimonial dispute between the parties. The statements of the petitioners No.4 and 6 already stand recorded by the investigating agency.

3. The learned counsel for respondent No.8/Kulwinder Kaur admits that the statements of the witnesses and petitioners No.4 and 6 stand

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recorded. As regards threat to the life and liberty of the petitioners, he contends that it is a matrimonial dispute and Kulwinder Kaur/respondent No.8 is not threatening the petitioners in any manner.

4. The learned counsel for the State on instructions from ASI Balkar Singh submits that as a matrimonial dispute is pending between the parties and civil proceedings have already been initiated, the State shall not interfere in any manner unless an offence is committed.

5. In view of the above, no further orders are required to be passed. Disposed of.
