AMARJOT BHATTI J. (ORAL)

1. Petitioner-Rohini Arora filed this petition under Section 528 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 for quashing of FIR No.214 dated 13.05.2024 (Annexure P-1), registered under Sections 323, 341, 506 of IPC, at Police Station Civil Lines Sirsa, District Sirsa and all the subsequent proceedings arising therefrom, qua petitioner, in light of the compromise effected between the parties dated 20.12.2024 (Annexure P-3).

2. As per facts of the case, complainant Aarti Talwar gave her statement to the police that her son Nitin Talwar was married with Roini Arora. Due to matrimonial dispute, she started residing in her parental house for the last about 2 years. She filed various cases against them. On 13.05.2024, she was present in the court along with her husband and son. When they came out in the parking area of courts Sirsa, Rohini Arora blocked their way by parking her scooty in front of them and hit her legs with said scooty. Her husband and son



rescued her and Rohini Arora managed to escape from there. With these allegations, present FIR has been registered.

3. Petitioner filed this petition for quashing of aforesaid FIR on the basis of compromise. Vide order dated 05.02.2025, petitioner and respondent No.2 were directed to appear before the trial Court/Illaq Magistrate for recording their statements on the basis of compromise. Detailed report regarding compromise has been received from the court of Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Sirsa dated 09.04.2025. Statement of respondent No.2 has been recorded where she confirmed the compromise with petitioner. She confirmed that this compromise has been effected voluntarily and without any coercion and undue influence and she has no objection regarding quashing of FIR.

Learned counsel representing State has filed status report, which is taken on record.

4. Petitioner- Rohini Arora also confirmed this fact in her separate statement. She filed affidavit that she is not involved or declared as proclaimed offender in any other criminal case.

5. Therefore, from the report of Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Sirsa, it is clear that compromise has been effected between the parties without any pressure, coercion or undue influence. They have mutually settled all their claims. They will be able to live in peace and harmony. No purpose would be served with the continuation of criminal proceedings. They have also effected compromise in FIR No.364 dated 08.06.2022, registered under Sections 506, 498-A, 406, 354-A, 323 of IPC, at Police Station Civil Lines Sirsa, District Sirsa bearing CRM-M-6591-2025 fixed for toady.



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6. Gainful reference can be made to the judgment of Larger Bench of Five Judges of this High Court cited in **2007(3) R.C.R. (Criminal) 1052 tilted as Kulwinder Singh and Ors. Vs. State of Punjab and Anr.,** where it was explained that ‘there can never be any hard and fast category which can be prescribed to enable the court to exercise its power under Section 482 of Cr.P.C. The only principle that can be laid down is the one which has been incorporated in the section itself i.e. to prevent abuse of the process of any court or to secure the ends of justice.’

7. Therefore, by relying upon the ratio of the aforesaid judgment, no purpose would be served with the continuation of criminal proceedings. Considering these facts, the petition filed by the petitioner is accepted and FIR No.214 dated 13.05.2024 (Annexure P-1), registered under Sections 323, 341, 506 of IPC, at Police Station Civil Lines Sirsa, District Sirsa and all other consequential proceedings arising therefrom are quashed qua petitioner.
