1.            This petition has been filed under Section 528 of the Bharatiya  
Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023, seeking quashing of DDR No.3 dated  
20.08.2023 under Sections 341/323/148/149 IPC (Section 325 IPC added  
later on) registered at Police Station Dharamkot, District Moga in FIR No.186  
dated 19.08.2023 under Sections 341, 323, 148, 149 IPC (Section 201 IPC  
added later on) registered at Police Station Dharamkot, District Moga, and all  
other subsequent proceedings arising therefrom in view of the compromise  
dated 17.12.2024 (Annexure P-3)

2.            The following order was passed on 04.02.2025:-

*“Prayer is for quashing of DDR No.3 dated 20.8.2023 under  
Sections 341, 323, 148, 149 IPC and Section 325 IPC in FIR No. 186  
dated 19.8.2023 registered under Sections 341, 323, 148, 149, 201  
IPC at Police Station Dharamkot, District Moga on the basis of  
compromise.*

*Notice of motion.*



*At this stage, Ms. Meenu Verma, Advocate, accepts notice on behalf of the complainant/respondents No.2 to 7. She admitted the correctness of compromise and stated that she has no objection if this petition is allowed.*

*On the asking of this Court, Mr. Jasjeet Singh Dhaliwal, AAG, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of the State. He does not wish to file any reply as the parties are stated to have effected the compromise.*

*So, the parties are directed to appear before the learned trial court/Illaq Magistrate on 7.3.2025 or any other date convenient to the trial Court/Illaq Magistrate and to get record their statements regarding compromise and after recording their statements, learned trial Court/Illaq Magistrate, is directed to send the same along with his report regarding the genuineness of compromise on or before the date fixed in the instant petition specifically with regard to the following facts:-*

- 1. Number of persons arrayed as accused in the FIR.*
- 2. Whether any accused is proclaimed offender.*
- 3. Stage of the trial/proceedings.*
- 4. Whether the compromise is genuine, voluntary and without any coercion or undue influence.*

*To come up on 29.4.2025 for awaiting the report.*

*A copy of this order be sent to the learned trial Court/Illaq Magistrate, through electronic mode, for compliance.”*

3. In compliance of the aforesaid order, a report dated 19.03.2025 has been received from the concerned jurisdictional Court that the compromise between the parties is genuine and arrived at without any pressure or coercion from anyone.

4. In view of the compromise and the ratio of law laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **Narinder Singh and others vs. State of Punjab**



**and another, (2014) 6 SCC 466 and Shakuntala Sawhney (Mrs) Vs. Kaushalya (Mrs.) and others (1980) 1 SCC 63** and Full Bench of this Court in **Kulwinder Singh Vs. State of Punjab 2007 (3) RCR (Crl.) 1052**, this petition is allowed and DDR No.3 dated 20.08.2023 under Sections 341/323/148/149 IPC (Section 325 IPC added later on) registered at Police Station Dharamkot, District Moga in FIR No.186 dated 19.08.2023 under Sections 341, 323, 148, 149 IPC (Section 201 IPC added later on) registered at Police Station Dharamkot, District Moga, and all other subsequent proceedings arising out of the same are quashed, qua the petitioners.
