KARAMJIT SINGH, J. (ORAL)

1. The present petition has been filed by the petitioner under Section 483. of BNSS 2023 seeking grant of regular bail in case having FIR No.185 dated 31.08.2024 under Sections 109, 333, 118(1), 115(2), 126(2), 351(1), 351(3), 324(4), 324(5), 191(3), 190 of BNS 2023, Police Station Sadar, Ludhiana (Annexure P-1).

2. The allegations in nutshell are that on 26.08.2024 on account of some minor road side accident, altercation took place between the parties, as a result of which complainant Sahil Singh sustained injuries at the hands of accused persons including the present petitioner who was stated to be armed with khanda at the time of occurrence. During investigation, the petitioner was arrested and aforesaid weapon used by him in commission of crime was recovered at the instance of the petitioner.

3. Counsel for the petitioner inter alia submits that the petitioner is falsely implicated in the present case and otherwise also the injuries sustained by the complainant are found to be simple in nature and the petitioner is in custody for the last more than 7 months and that on completion of investigation, police has presented the challan and similarly



situated co-accused Mangal Singh @ Manga is given benefit of regular bail Annexure P-4 while one another co-accused Satbir Kaur is granted interim bail Annexure P-3 by this Court. It is further submitted that it will take time for the trial to conclude and that no purpose is going to be served by keeping the petitioner in custody for any longer period.

4. The present petition is resisted by the State counsel who on instructions from ASI Avtar Singh submits that petitioner and other accused caused injuries to complainant with different weapons and at the time of occurrence, the petitioner was armed with sharp edged khanda. However, the State counsel has not disputed the fact that petitioner is incarcerated for the last more than 7 months and that all the injuries on person of complainant are found to be simple in nature and that the trial is at its initial stage and that similarly situated co-accused Mangal Singh @ Manga is granted regular bail while one another co-accused Satbir Kaur is granted interim bail by this Court. The copy of the opinion of the concerned doctor whereby all the injuries are found to be simple in nature, is taken on record.

5. In view of the fact that the petitioner is behind bars for the last more than 7 months and further only simple injuries are attributed to the petitioner and further it will take time for the trial to terminate, no useful purpose is going to be served by prolonging judicial custody of the present petitioner.

6. In view of the above, without commenting on the merits of the case, the present petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on regular bail subject to his furnishing bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Chief Judicial Magistrate/Duty Magistrate concerned.
