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LAPITA BANERJI, J. (ORAL)

1. The prayer in the present petition filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India is for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus to adjust the dues payable by the petitioner, since deceased, as per the Special Settlement Scheme.

2. It is submitted that the petitioner has passed away and his property was sold in 1999. The auction sale was also confirmed by the petitioner on May 19, 1999. The original petitioner had filed an affidavit long time back on April 18, 1999 whereby the sale proceeds were required to be distributed in a certain manner.

3. Learned counsel appearing for respondent No.4 submits that the

same has been done as per the wishes of the petitioner (since deceased).

4. Therefore, there is no question as on date for consideration of the petitioner's dues to be settled pursuant to the Special Settlement Scheme of the year 2000.

5. In view of the aforesaid submissions made on behalf of the State-respondents, CWP-14117-2000 is **disposed of** without any further orders.

6. The legal representatives of the writ petitioner were already brought on record vide order dated March 25, 2025. No further orders are needed to be passed.

7. Connected applications, if any, are also accordingly disposed of.
