1. Through the instant writ petition, cast under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, a prayer is made for issuance of a writ, in the nature of quo-warranto, against the respondents No.3 to 6.
2. The instant writ petition is pending adjudication since 2001.
3. This Court, on dated 24.03.2025, had directed the learned State Counsel to inform this Court, as to whether, the respondents No.3 to 6, are still in service, or not.
4. Today learned counsel for the State, on instructions from the Legal Advisor, Municipal Council, Amritsar, informs this Court, that respondents No.3, 5 and 6, has already retired from the service, on attaining age of superannuation, whereas, the respondent No.4, was dismissed from service, in the year 2018.
5. There is no representation on behalf of the petitioner, today in the Court. Even, on the earlier occasions as well, the petitioner has remained



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unrepresented.

6. At this stage, this Court, can safely presume that the petitioner is not interested in pursuing the instant *lis*, as the cause of action does not survive.

7. Consequently, the instant writ petition is **dismissed for want of prosecution.**

8. Pending applications, if any, stand disposed of accordingly.
