Challenge in the present writ petition is to the order dated 02.06.2023 by which claim of the petitioner for grant of minimum scale prescribed for the posts has been rejected and a further prayer to grant the minimum scale prescribed for the posts alongwith Dearness Allowance to the petitioners.

Counsel for the petitioners has moved an application bearing CM-9240-CWP-2025 to dispose of the present writ petition in terms of the judgment passed by this Court in LPA-1102-2024 titled as “***Sant Longowal Institute of Engineering and Technology, Longowal versus Ranjit Singh***” decided on 22.04.2025.

The present writ petition is accordingly disposed of with the consent of the parties and without commenting anything on the merits of the case with a direction to the respondents to treat this writ petition as a representation and to take a considerate decision in light of the judgment dated 22.04.2025 passed in LPA-1102-2024 titled as “***Sant Longowal Institute of Engineering and Technology, Longowal versus Ranjit Singh***”, within a period of three months of the receipt of certified copy of this order.

Needless to mention that in the event the petitioners are found eligible for the benefits as claimed in the light of the judgment passed by the

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Hon’ble Division Bench, the necessary benefits shall be released to them within a further period of two months.
