1. Prayer in the present petition filed under Section 528 of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023 is for quashing of impugned order dated 03.07.2024 passed learned Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Amritsar vide which, regular bail of the petitioner has been cancelled in FIR No.320 dated 17.11.2022 under Sections 452, 427, 506 and 34 of IPC at Police Station Sadar, Amritsar, District Police Commissionerate.

2. On 20.03.2025, following order was passed :

“Counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner was granted regular bail by the Court concerned vide order dated 7.2.2023 (Annexure P-2). Thereafter, the petitioner was regularly appearing before the trial Court but due to some unavoidable circumstances, he got absented in the trial proceedings and resultantly, his bail was cancelled and he was ordered to be summoned through non-bailable warrants of arrest vide Annexure P-3 dated 3.7.2024.

Counsel for the petitioner further submits that absence of the petitioner before the trial Court on the date fixed was not intentional and even now the petitioner is ready and willing to join the trial proceedings at the earliest in order to avoid any further delay in trial.



Notice of motion.

Mr. Jasjeet Singh Dhaliwal, AAG, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of the State and submits that the petitioner got absented on 23.4.2024 without any intimation to the Court concerned and thus, the trial Court rightly passed order dated 3.7.2024 (Annexure P-3) in accordance with law.

Apparently, it appears that this was single default on the part of the petitioner.

Now be listed on 21.5.2025.

In the meantime, the petitioner is hereby directed to appear before the trial Court within a period of next 15 days and on his doing so, the petitioner is to be released on interim bail by the said Court to its own satisfaction till the next date of hearing subject to costs of 7 5000/- to be deposited by the petitioner with District Legal Services Authority concerned.”

3. In compliance of the aforesaid order, the petitioner has appeared before the learned trial Court. His personal bonds and surety bonds have been restored. The petitioner has also deposited the cost of Rs.5,000/-. Copy of order dated 26.03.2025 passed by learned Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Amritsar is produced on record. Registry is directed to tag the same at the appropriate place.

4. In view of the above, no further directions are required to be passed in the present petition and the same stands disposed of as having been rendered as infructuous.
