Prayer in the present petition is for directing the respondents to consider the revision of petitioner's pension and giving other benefits as per 1st increment approved as per order dated 04.08.2020 (Annexure P-7) and seeking approval of 2nd increment as per ACP Scheme of 2006 after completion of service in same cadre as Poultry Inspector for 14 years.

After arguing at some length, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that with regard to his grievance, the petitioner has submitted numerous representations followed by a legal notice dated 05.10.2024 (Annexure P-9) but the respondents have not taken any action on the same till date.

Notice of motion.

Mr. Balwinder Singh, AAG, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of the respondents and prays for some time to complete instructions and file response, if so advised.

Learned counsel for the petitioner, however, contends that he would be satisfied at this stage, in case respondent No.2- Director, Animal Husbandry Punjab, SAS Nagar (Mohali) is directed to consider and decide the legal notice dated 05.10.2024 (Annexure P-9) served by the petitioner, by passing a speaking order in a time bound manner.

Learned State Counsel does not have any objection to the request made by learned counsel for the petitioner.

Accordingly, in view of the above; with the consent of the parties and without commenting anything on the merits of the case, the present petition is disposed of while directing respondent No.2 to consider and decide the legal notice dated 05.10.2024 (Annexure P-9) by passing a reasoned and speaking order after affording an opportunity of hearing to the respective parties within a period of four months of the receipt of certified copy of this order.

Needless to mention that upon considering the said legal notice, if the claim of the petitioner is found to be genuine and admissible as per law, in that eventuality, the consequential benefits shall be released in favour of the petitioner within a further period of two months.

Petition stands disposed of accordingly.
