JAGMOHAN BANSAL, J. (Oral)

1. On 20.03.2025, this Court passed the following order: -

“The petitioner through instant petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India is seeking direction to respondent to release her family pension alongwith other terminal dues.

The petitioner is claiming that her husband has passed away while in harness. She being widow of ASI Sukhwinder Singh is entitled to family pension as well as terminal dues.

This Court has noticed that every day multiple petitions are being filed claiming promotion, seniority, release of pension/family pension or ACP by employees of State Government and its instrumentalities. Petitions are filed even after many years from the date of retirement. The parties directly approach this Court seeking direction to respondent to extend them benefit of promotion, seniority or ACP. These matters need to be examined at the level of Department. There is need to constitute an Employees Grievance Redressal Committee which should consider these issues so



that most of the issues may be settled at the level of Committee.

The Chief Secretary, State of Punjab is hereby requested to examine the issue to constitute an Employees Grievance Redressal Committee to primarily consider issues of promotion, seniority, ACP, pension/family pension etc.

Let the response of Chief Secretary be filed before the adjourned date.

Adjourned to 21.04.2025.

2. Affidavit dated 21.04.2025 of Sh. K.A.P. Sinha, Chief Secretary to Government of Punjab filed by respondent-State is taken on record. Registry is directed to tag the same at an appropriate place.

3. Status report by way of affidavit of Rajesh Kumar, P.P.S. Deputy Superintendent of Police (HQ), Jalandhar (Rural) filed on behalf of respondent Nos.1, 2 & 4 to 6 is also taken on record. Registry is directed to tag the same at an appropriate place.

4. Learned counsel for the parties are *ad idem* that relief claimed in the instant petition stands granted, thus, instant petition has rendered infructuous.

5. Disposed of as having been rendered infructuous.
