1. The petitioner is seeking quashing of letter/order dated 06.03.2025 (Annexure P-3) passed by respondent No.3, whereby application moved by the petitioner for grant of emergency parole is dismissed, and to release him on emergency parole for four weeks on medical grounds in case FIR No.200 dated 05.10.2023 under Section 306 of the IPC registered at Police Station Buria, District Yamuna Nagar.

2. In compliance of the order dated 25.03.2025, learned State counsel has filed the medical condition report by way of an affidavit of the Deputy Superintendent, District Jail, Yamuna Nagar on behalf of the respondent-State in the Court today, which is taken on record subject to all just exceptions.

3. Learned State counsel, while drawing the attention of this Court to the affidavit, which has been filed today, has not been able to dispute that the petitioner indeed underwent Coronary Angiography on 20.02.2025 due

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to blockage in his arteries; he was admitted at the Heart Center, Ambala Cantt. and thereafter, was discharged on 25.02.2025. Learned State counsel has submitted that the Cardiologist had prescribed medicines and advised followup after one month. It has also been submitted that the petitioner is now stable and would be taken to the Cardiologist for his followup after one month.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that since the petitioner has admittedly undergone a major procedure involving his heart, a compassionate and lenient view be taken and he be extended the concession of emergency parole on medical grounds, so that he can get personal care and nursing at his home.

4. In the facts and circumstances as enumerated hereinabove and in view of the medical condition of the petitioner, this Court deems it fit to allow the instant petition and grant parole/furlough to the petitioner till 02.05.2025.

5. The petition as such is allowed, and the petitioner be granted parole/furlough till 02.05.2025 to the satisfaction of the District Magistrate concerned. He will surrender back in the concerned Jail on 03.05.2025 before 5 p.m. The District Magistrate would impose any suitable conditions, which may be required to secure the presence of the petitioner in the jail after the expiry of parole period.
