VIKAS BAHL, J. (ORAL)

1. The plaintiffs-present appellants had filed a suit for declaration that plaintiff No.1 was entitled to get a post on compassionate ground and that plaintiff Nos.1 to 3 were entitled to get the amount of gratuity and G.P. fund etc. with interest in equal shares. The suit filed by the plaintiffs was partly decreed. Appeal filed by the State of Haryana was partly allowed and the judgment of the trial Court was modified and the prayer made by plaintiff No.1 for getting compassionate appointment was rejected.

2. A perusal of the zimni orders would show that there is no stay order in favour of the present appellants. A perusal of the service report would show that appellant Nos.1 and 2 have died and appellant No.3 has



been served.

3. Learned counsel for the appellants has submitted that in spite of best efforts, he has not been able to get in touch with the legal representatives of appellant Nos.1 and 2 and appellant No.3 and the said persons have not approached the office in the recent past so as to inform the Court as to whether they wish to pursue the present appeal or not. It is submitted that in such circumstances, the present appeal be disposed of at this stage but liberty be granted to legal representatives of appellant Nos.1 and 2 and appellant No.3 to revive the same in case any cause survives to them.

4. Keeping in view the abovesaid facts and circumstances, the present appeal is disposed of at this stage with liberty aforesaid.
