The jurisdiction of this Court has been invoked under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuing directions to the respondents to release the petitioner on parole/emergency parole for eight weeks for getting better medical treatment, as the petitioner has suffered 40% to 50% burn injuries in an incident/accident occurred on 19.01.2025, under Sections 3(1) (d) & 4 of the Punjab Good Conduct Prisoners (Temporary Release) Act, 1962.

It is argued on behalf of the petitioner that during the period of parole an unfortunate accident took place on 19.01.2025 and the petitioner suffered burn injuries to the extent of 40% to 50% on her body. The petitioner further submits that she surrendered to the jail authorities on the scheduled date, 28.02.2025, and was granted a one-week extension due to medical reasons. Subsequently, she surrendered on 08.03.2025, and her condition remains critical due to the severity of the burn injuries.

Notice of motion.

On the asking of Court, Mr. Jaspal Singh Guru, AAG Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of respondent/State.

The District Magistrate, Sangrur, is directed to look and examine the matter after taking medical opinion from the Board of Directors at Civil Hospital, Sangrur. He/She shall also pass a speaking order on the request of the petitioner for grant of parole of 4 weeks after considering the said medical report, several factors and circumstances as per law within a period of one week from today.

In the light of above, the petition stands disposed off.
