AARADHNA SAWHNEY, J. (ORAL)

1. Petitioner, namely, Gurdeep Singh, who has been arrayed as co-accused in case FIR No.252 dated 20.09.2023, registered against him at the instance of respondent No.2 – Divah Kumar Goel (complainant) for commission of offences punishable u/s 381, 506, 34 IPC at Police Station Phillaur, District Jalandhar, has filed the present petition for quashing of the aforesaid FIR along with all consequential proceedings emanating therefrom.

2. Status Report dated 01.07.2025 by way of affidavit of Mr. Sarwan Singh, Deputy Superintendent of Police, Sub-Division, Phillaur Jalandhar has been filed on behalf of the respondent-State, which is taken on record. In para 6 thereof, it has been mentioned that petitioner has joined the investigation. Though whereabouts of co-accused Jiwan Singh have still not been disclosed.

3. On 04.04.2025, following order was passed:-

“Contends, inter alia, that matter has been amicably settled between the parties i.e. petitioner as well as de facto complainant/respondent No.2 at their own level.

Notice of motion.

Ms. Manjot Kaur, learned AAG, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of respondent No.1; seeks time to have instructions and/or to file written response in the matter.

Notice to respondent No.2 in due course.

Posted for 02.07.2025.

In the meanwhile, petitioner shall join investigation before the Investigating Officer; but he be not arrested till the next date of hearing.”

4. Keeping in view the above submissions made by learned State counsel and the fact that the petitioner had joined the investigation consequent to the order dated 04.04.2025 passed by co-ordinate Bench of this Court, interim bail granted vide order dated 04.04.2025 is hereby confirmed, subject to conditions as envisaged under Section 482(2) BNSS. Further the petitioner is directed to join investigation as and when required in future by way of written notice for such purpose to be served by Investigating Officer of this case upon the petitioner; he will not tamper with the evidence nor will influence the witnesses and will not leave the country without prior permission of the Court.

5. The petition stands allowed.
