1. Learned counsel for the petitioner argues that the petitioner is not being given the school transfer/leaving certificate by respondent No. 4-School, which is causing prejudice to the petitioner.

3. On the asking of the Court, Mr. T.P.S. Chawla, Senior Deputy Advocate General, Punjab, who is present in Court, accepts notice on behalf of the respondent-State and Mr. Ranjit Singh Kalra, Advocate with Ms. Mona Yadav, Advocate, accepts notice on behalf of respondent No. 2-PSEB.

4. Learned counsel for respondent No. 2 upon instructions from Sh. Harsimran Singh, Clerk of School, submits that the school transfer/leaving certificate has already been issued and the same was taken by the



father of the petitioner. Learned counsel submits that another copy of the school transfer/leaving certificate has been handed over to the learned counsel for the petitioner and the same can be treated as a transfer certificate for all intents and purposes.

5. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that keeping in view the stamped copy of the school transfer/leaving certificate that has been given to him in Court today, which can be used to secure admission in Jalandhar, the present petition may kindly be disposed of having been not pressed any further.
