NAMIT KUMAR, J. (ORAL)

1. On oral request made by learned counsel for the petitioners, Mission Director, National Health Mission, Punjab is impleaded as respondent No.4 in the instant petition. Registry is directed to carry out the necessary corrections in the memo of parties.

2. The present petition has been filed by the petitioners under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ of certiorari, quashing the order dated 12.03.2025 (Annexure P-13), whereby the claim of the petitioners for grant of minimum of the pay scale i.e. basic pay + dearness allowance (as revised from time to time), at par with their regular counterparts, from the date(s) of their initial contractual appointment(s) is rejected. Further, seeking a writ of mandamus, directing the respondents to grant the petitioners minimum of the pay scale i.e. basic pay + dearness allowance (as revised from time to time), at par with their regular counterparts, from the date(s) of their initial contractual appointment(s) and to grant consequential



3. Learned counsel for the petitioners has placed reliance upon the judgment passed by this Court in *CWP No.26367 of 2018 titled as ‘Pritpal Kaur and others Vs. State of Punjab and another’, decided on 25.11.2024*, wherein similar claims raised by various similarly situated persons have been accepted and the said judgment has been upheld by a Division Bench of this Court in *LPA No.1149 of 2025 titled as ‘National Health Mission, Punjab Vs. Pritpal Kaur and others’, decided on 23.07.2025*. Even, the SLP preferred against the said judgment has been dismissed by the Hon’ble Supreme Court in *Special Leave to Appeal (c) No.25633 of 2025 titled as ‘National Health Mission Vs. Pritpal Kaur and others’ decided on 19.09.2025*.

4. On the asking of the Court, Mr. Anil Kumar Sharma, Advocate accepts notice on behalf of newly added respondent No.4 and submits that the claim of the petitioners shall be re-considered in view of the abovesid judgment.

5. In view of the above, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.4 to reconsider the claims of the petitioners within a period of 04 months and if the petitioners are found entitled to the relief sought, the same shall be granted to them within a period of 02 months thereafter.

6. Pending application, if any, shall stands disposed of accordingly.
