1. The present petition has been filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing respondents No.2 and 3 to protect the life and liberty of petitioners at the hands of respondents No.4 to 6.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that the petitioner No.2 was already married with one Surinder Kaur, but due to some temperamental differences, the marriage of petitioner No.2 was dissolved with Surinder Kaur, by way of decree of divorce by mutual consent vide judgment dated 17.09.2022 passed by learned Additional Principal Judge, Family Court, Ludhiana (Annexure P-4). Both the present petitioners have now married against the wishes of respondents No.4 to 6 and they claim themselves to be major and seek protection to their life and liberty. They apprehend danger from respondents No.4 to 6. They have placed on record marriage certificate (Annexure P-5) to



substantiate their claim. The petitioners have also submitted a representation dated 07.04.2025 (Annexure P-7) to respondent No.2 but no action has been taken so far.

- 3. Notice of motion to the official respondents only.
- 4. Mr. Subhash Godara, Addl. A.G., Punjab who is present in Court, accepts notice for the official respondents. Learned counsel for the petitioners is directed to supply a copy of complete paper book to learned State counsel during course of the day.
- 5. Without commenting on validity of the marriage allegedly performed by the petitioners and entering upon an exercise to evaluate the evidentiary value of the documents placed on the file, I dispose of this petition with direction to respondent No.2 to decide the representation of the petitioners (Annexure P-7) within a period of one week from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order and grant them protection, if there is any threat to their life and liberty.
- 6. It is made clear that this order shall not be taken to protect the petitioners from legal action for violation of law, if any committed by them.
