1. The petitioner, under Section 528 of BNSS, 2023, is seeking issuance of directions to the official respondents No.2 and 3 to conduct fair and impartial investigation on his applications (Annexures P-2 and P-3) submitted to respondent No.2 regarding unnatural death of his young son, and to take legal action against the accused persons after registration of FIR under the relevant sections.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that on the basis of suspicion, he lodged a DDR on 28.10.2024 (Annexure P-1) and thereafter, on enquiry, he came to know about certain people, who were responsible for the death of his son. He submitted an application dated 16.11.2024 (Annexure P-2) to respondent No.2 for registration of FIR against the accused persons. He submitted another application dated 02.12.2024 (Annexure P-3) apprehending danger to his life and his family's life,

however, it had failed to yield any response. It has been submitted that the official respondents were under a legal obligation to pass an appropriate order on his applications/complaints. Learned counsel submits that at this stage, the petitioner would be satisfied if directions are issued to respondent No.2-Senior Superintendent of Police, Amritsar Rural, to look into his applications (Annexures P-2 and P-3) and take appropriate steps in accordance with law.

3. Notice of motion to official respondents only.

4. On asking of the Court, Mr. Amit Rana, Senior DAG, Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of the official respondents.

5. In the wake of the limited prayer of the petitioner, the instant petition is disposed of and respondent No.2-Senior Superintendent of Police, Amritsar Rural, is directed to look into the grievance of the petitioner and take appropriate steps, if any required, under the provisions of law. However, if respondent No.2 does not find any substance in the allegations levelled in the applications (Annexures P-2 and P-3), then the petitioner shall be duly informed as per the parameters laid down by the Supreme Court in ***Lalita Kumari Versus Government of Uttar Pradesh & Ors., 2013 (4) RCR (Criminal) 979.***
